Following the damaging storm on Saturday night, Sunday dawned a little misty but the day was a cracker with lots of sunshine and temperatures in the high 20's.

We set off over the hills through Governors Bay and Gebbies Pass around Motokurara and headed south to tour around Lake

Ellesmere. We visited many of the little settlements on the lake edge, the first being the Greenpark Huts, then the Selwyn Huts alongside the dead green waters of the lower Selwyn River.

After another 7 kms we found the lower Selwyn Huts with boat ramp and access to the lake and it's many activities. Returning further south we arrived at the reserve at Timber Yard Point and soon the 10 cars and occupants joined for a picnic lunch.



Whilst we were having our lunch there was a kite boarder racing around and doing flips on the lake - very impressive.

We next headed toward the Lake opening passing more fishing huts along the way. The Taumutu Church was built on the old Pa site which was a major trading post in 1895.

Next on the list was the better known Rakaia Huts. These huts varied in size, style, condition from fishing cribs to modernised, freshly painted with garden

surrounding them cottages.



The views of Banks Peninsular from the "other side" were clear and really made the trip so worthwhile. Our coffee stop over the river was disrupted by a 4 car pile up on the bridge so some of our group returned to Christchurch without crossing the river.

Most of our group had not visited these areas so it made the day more interesting. We hope to follow this up by travelling north around the lake and onto the Peninsular on another run.

We enjoyed our day out motoring with friends. Thanks to Gill and Mel Peters for setting this day up.
