CAR OF THE MONTH



The Daimler is the Grand Old lady of our Sunday Runs. Geoff & Carol Westoby have owned it since August 2008. A 4.2 litre Twin Cam 6 - 2 ½ ton - 8 seater

The car is a 1975 Daimler Limousine and was originally built for the British Ambassador in Ethiopia. It then went to the Australian Embassy in Abbis Ababa & was sold to Mr Smith in Sept 1986 for \$3000 US and was driven in Zambia as a family car. In the late 80's it was sent by ship to Victoria Australia where it was slightly damaged – it then stayed in storage until coming to New Zealand in May 2004. It was located in Tai Tapu and came to the Westoby's in August 2008. Was registered in 2009. It was RED when received so daughter Vanessa painted in back to its original colour BLACK!

The vehicle has been fitted with protective devices for the Ambassador. Bullet proof materials in all doors, windows, quarters and rear seat squab. Double laminated glass in all windows including the windscreen and rear window. A vehicle alarm system with switches in both the passenger and drive compartments which cannot cancel each other out. The car has security bolts on all doors. Siren and flashing lights
