#### 2017 Classic Marathon

Just a note to advise that the 2017 Classic Marathon will be held in late April 2017.

The route will be based on the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Rallying Tour plotted by G1 and G2 and run earlier this year.

It will be a mixed surface tour and will use some of the South Islands iconic Rally Special Stages.

The event will start in Picton or Nelson and at this stage we plan to finish in Dunedin or Oamaru. The organisers want to run the tour over 8 days instead of the usual 7 and seek your feedback on this.

The final plotting run will be held after the Alpine has finished. Let a committee member know what you think about the slightly extended duration.

#### 2019 WA Odyssey
